Life got a little more hectic in 2020 when we welcomed our Riley girl to the family, and even more so just ten weeks ago with the arrival of Kai, but you still let me do my thing, and it hasn't gone unnoticed that without you, my involvement in the club would not be possible.

Treasurer's Report- Andrew Eustace

It was good to see a little bit of normality back this season after a COVID19 effected 2020/2021.

Even though we had a delayed start to the season and only operated for 14 weeks comparatively to a normal 21-week season, the club had a solid year from a financial perspective.

We posted another profit of \$7,863 off the back of the profit we made last season which is a great result for the club. Some of the key items of focus/highlights are:

- Sponsorship – The sponsorship team posted an outstanding result this season. All the hard work that commenced last season paid off even more this season. The team generated \$18.3K in sponsorship, up 50% from last year and doubled the amount from two seasons ago. The club will be aiming for our members to continue to get behind the sponsorship directory and add additional sponsor's next season.
- Merchandise - There was a large spike in merchandise sales this season due to the club rolling out their new range of club coloured merchandise as well as additional merchandise items being made available on the back of changing suppliers to Swivs Locker. It's been a positive move as now all items must be paid upfront on their web based online ordering system and we no longer have to hold excess stock at the club. The club no longer has to carry the cost of holding merchandise.
- Membership Fees – Due to having three senior teams instead of four, membership fees were down this season.
- Strategic Plan – The club has invested in the club's future and engaged an external consultant to help rollout a strategic plan. This incurred a \$5.5K cost to complete the plan.
- Council Facility Fees - Due to COVID19 we were very fortunate that the Council only charged us 50% of the usual annual fee to use the clubrooms and ovals. Saving circa of \$3K.

The club received a couple of grants this season and we are still to incur \$3.5K of these grants to replace the roller shutters to the club's front windows at Guy Turner, this will be incurred next season. Including the \$3.5K there are \$7.5K of grants received over the last three seasons that need to be spent going forward. The club was also fortunate enough that the damaged pitch at Sasses was replaced by council, so the money the club was going to invest in this area was another saving.

Midway through the season, we rolled out a Point of Sale system called "Square". The system is very user friendly which saw bar staff embrace and get behind the it. There are many positives with using a system like this which will make it easier next season to record all incoming transactions and identify which profit centres are making profit and which ones that need reviewing.

There will be a continued focus next season to further improve our reporting processes now that the "Square" has been implemented. We will have a full season of data to analyse.

We are technically starting next season \$7.5K in the red with the grants that need to be spent so the club will be aiming for a small profit as a minimum. We should hopefully have a COVID free season in the clubrooms which will help our fundraising activities.

Thank you to all members of the Committee for their hard work throughout the season and in particular to Tim Court, Phil Leach and a special mention to Marcus Adams for organising the new merchandise supplier / ordering system as well as helping roll out the point of sale system.

Senior Coaches Report- Todd Cordwell

The 2021/22 season would thankfully be less influenced by COVID than the previous summer. With immunisations proving effective and lockdowns ending cricket was getting closer to normality. Additionally, for the second time we were to play one-day format matches for the entirety of the season. Pandemic protocols were easier to navigate, but training again only commenced just prior to the first match.

Despite our best efforts, we unfortunately had to concede defeat and withdraw our 4th XI from competition. A number of factors contributed to this, and it will be vital to the health of the club that we rectify this and work hard to bolster our numbers as soon as possible.

Due to us dropping a side, the 4's from the previous season effectively became our 3rd XI and up until Christmas played in C Grade, until they eventually dropped back to M2. I was extremely proud of their efforts stepping up in standard and trying their hardest early in the season. The move to M2 was for the best and they started to play much better cricket in the back end of the season. Dan Southwood and Tim Court took over the captaincy this season and did an admirable job in leading their team mates.

The 2XI's was captained by Peter Eagles and after a difficult few seasons, there were some very positive signs shown. They ended up with five wins and were well in the hunt for a finals spot at times during the backend of the season. Hopefully the boys can take some momentum in to next year and continue to improve. Brendan Trump was the standout with the bat and Eoin Fay and Lachie Clarke were solid with the ball.

The 1XI showed great improvement, having finished sixth in the previous campaign and managed to fight through to a second Grand Final in three seasons. An amazing Preliminary Final fightback win over Templeton got us through to the Grand Final, but we were unfortunately outplayed by East Ringwood on the day.

Troy Gstrein was again outstanding with bat and ball, taking out the majority of the awards (including the Competition Bowling Award). Young Nick Sheridan debuted and played every game. Opening the bowling 1st XI is a massive achievement for a 16-year-old current junior player. I think we all look forward to seeing what he can achieve in the future for Bayswater Park.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank my Assistant Coaches Keith Smith, Justin Laughlin, Marcus Adams and captains; Peter Eagles, Dan Southwood and Tim Court. Congratulation on your efforts for the season.

1XI Report- Todd Cordwell

Making the Grand Final was a dramatic improvement on the season prior. To make our second Grand Final in three seasons really shows that we can be a very good side when we play our cricket with confidence. Unfortunately, it wasn't to be. Batting first and posting 9/124 was not ideal and a professional East Ringwood were too good, passing us without the loss of a wicket.

We finished the season with seven wins and five losses finishing third. We accounted for Warrandyte in the Semi-Final comfortably, holding them to 8/86 and passing them two wickets down. We played our best game of the season to beat top of the ladder Templeton in the Preliminary Final.

Templeton had control of the game with their first wicket falling just after drinks (1/106), having spilled some opportunities in the field. In an enormous fightback we managed to dismiss Templeton for 163. Marcus Adams was the hero with 7/14 off 5.2 overs, including a hat trick, in a ridiculously good performance. Our opening bats put on a partnership of 121, setting up the win, as we passed Templeton two wickets down with five overs to spare.

The improvement of Nick Sheridan from debuting in Round one to opening the bowling in our finals appearances was massive. To back up playing juniors in the morning and becoming an essential member of the side is a credit to his hard work over the course of the season. In Lachlan Bright, Nick Sheridan and Jordan Rutherford our bowling stocks are in good hands for years to come.

Lachlan Clarke, another current junior also debuted in the 1st XI and is another player that we hope will continue to improve and become a valuable player for BPCC in the future.

Troy Gstrein continued his outstanding form from previous years winning our batting and bowling averages and a swag of other awards. Most notably, he won the bowling award for the whole completion at RDCA Presentation night.

The 1's are an extremely committed group and were a pleasure to both captain and coach this season and success is just around the corner if we continue to work hard. The likely return of two-day cricket next season will reintroduce new challenges that we will require adjustments to stay competitive in come finals time. I'm sure we will relish the challenge once again however.

U10 Report- Robin Court

Despite the Sasses Ave ground being unavailable for much of the season and the continuing impact of COVID, we fielded two teams each week and 25 players represented the Club during the season.

None of this would be possible without the help of the families of the players and, on behalf of the Club, I want to thank everyone who helped at practice or umpired matches or cooked the BBQs or maintained order when enthusiasm got a bit out of control. Outdoor practice will start in early September and there is a chance that there will be some indoor practice available before then. We are still keen to have more girls play and a girls team is still an aim for the future.

Hopefully our new nets will be ready for the start of the season but Guy Turner may be out of action as the Council tries yet again to fix the drainage. The ground has been perpetually upgraded over many years and this is just another step. When I joined the Club in 19?? the ground was uneven and much smaller and highlighted by a large tree on the eastern boundary. (20m inside the current boundary) It was very dry during the summer and players were advised to field in front of the many cracks caused by the hot weather. In those days the Clubrooms were smaller than the Sasses shed - so progress can be a nuisance but worth it in the long run.
